1 The Grange, Park Hill



This sheltered accommodation is run by the Moseley and District Housing Association. With advice and encouragement from Moseley in Bloom the residents are working hard to bring their extensive grounds and garden back to life. Come and see their progress so far!

2 Moseley Park & Pool



Open to the public for the Saturday of the Open Gardens Weekend. The park dates back to 1899 and is the only surviving part of the Repton-designed landscaped gardens of Moseley Hall (1792). It contains the most stunning vistas across the lake and also has a bog garden with a series of bridges, a wildflower meadow and is a haven for wildlife.

3 St Mary's Church



An Open Weekend for the church coincides with our Open Gardens weekend and there is plenty of interest in the heritage trail, focusing on the local history associated with the churchyard, the display/demonstration offered by local beekeepers... and in the cream teas!

4 20 Reddings Road



A re-creation of a traditional Edwardian garden in keeping with the restoration of the house. Five steps into the garden but easy to access to view the garden from the patio.

5 34 Reddings Road



A mature, traditional garden with flower beds, established trees, two connecting ponds and vegetable beds. There are plenty of spaces to sit and view the garden. Partial access for wheelchairs and buggies. Live music by Second City Strummers.

6 49 Reddings Road

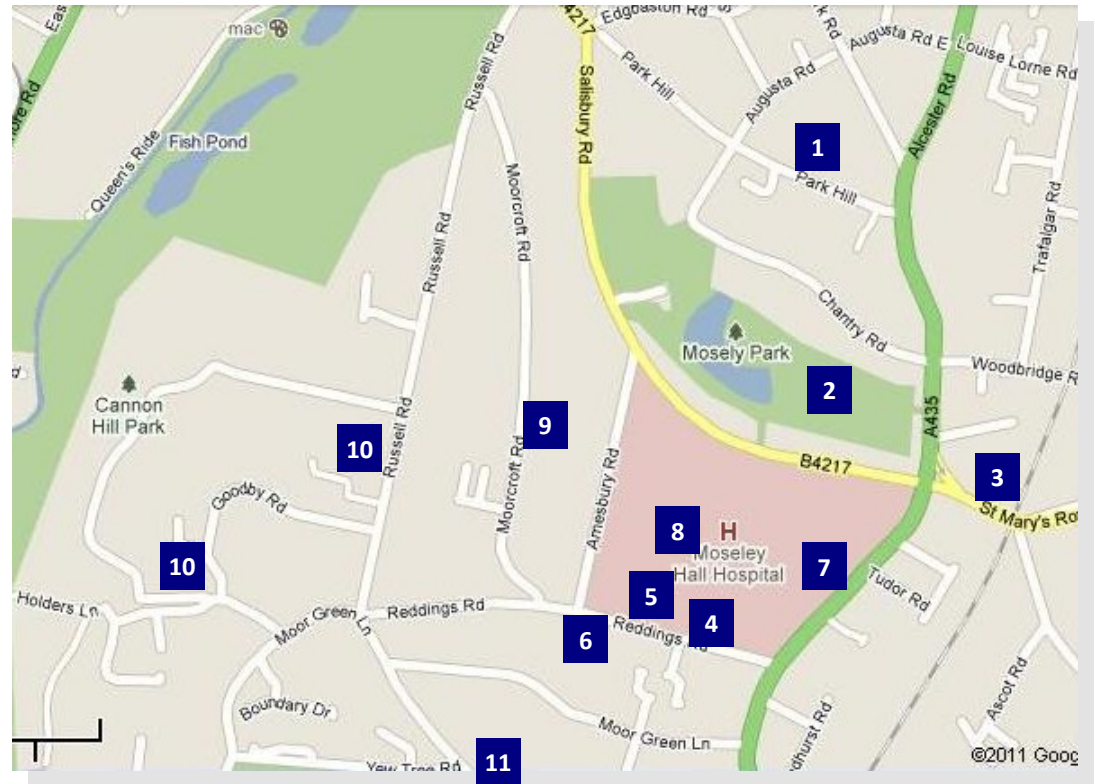


A suburban garden with a mix of mature and newly planted trees and herbaceous borders. This is a very wildlife friendly garden! Some steps within the garden.

7 Moseley Hall Dovecote, Alcester Road



Restored and maintained by Moseley Society volunteers. they have made tremendous progress in the last year in creating a community garden in keeping with the 18th century Dovecote which is also open today.

8 Moseley Hall Hospital



Gardening has long been used here as part of therapy and rehabilitation in the treatment of a range of illness and injuries. This weekend the hospital will offer the public a one-off opportunity to visit one of the therapeutic gardens first hand.

9 72 Moorcroft Road



Created and cared for over the course of many years it has some lovely trees and varied borders, rising quite steeply at the rear to give a sense of theatre. Steps down into the garden and to higher levels prohibit wheelchair access beyond the patio.

10 Moor Green Lane Allotments



A must for all allotment enthusiasts, this is a chance to look around one of Birmingham's biggest and most interesting sites. You are sure to see weird and wonderful ways of growing vegetables and fruit. Entrance on Holders Lane or Russell Road.

11 Four Seasons Nursery



A Nursery with a difference! As a satellite project of Moseley Day Care Centre it provides a wonderful opportunity for people with learning disabilities to discover the satisfaction of working with plants and to develop their gardening skills.
