Sunday 19th June Gardens

1 31 Greenend Road



A small stylish garden with flower beds and a vegetable plot, surrounded by mature trees. There is a recently designed central seating area.

2 37 Greenend Road

A well established garden with mature shrubs. Pots and bedding plants add splashes of colour. Note—there is a side entrance but not suitable for wheelchairs.

3 49 Greenhill Road



Showing lots of interesting design ideas both in the placing of varied plants, trees and shrubs, but also in its structural and ornamental features. Live music is also provided by Slow Train.

4 15 Thornley Close



Good access from road to patio area. Steps down to main garden which is small but with a lot of character. Mature shrubs and perennials, an interesting mix of unusual plants with garden art. A lovely lawn and seating areas in the main garden.

5 Billesley Lane Allotments:



Traditional allotments in a beautiful setting at the edge of Moseley Golf Club. Their annual Open Day coincides with and is part of the Open Gardens Weekend but note that there is no charge to visit the site. The composting toilet is not to be missed!

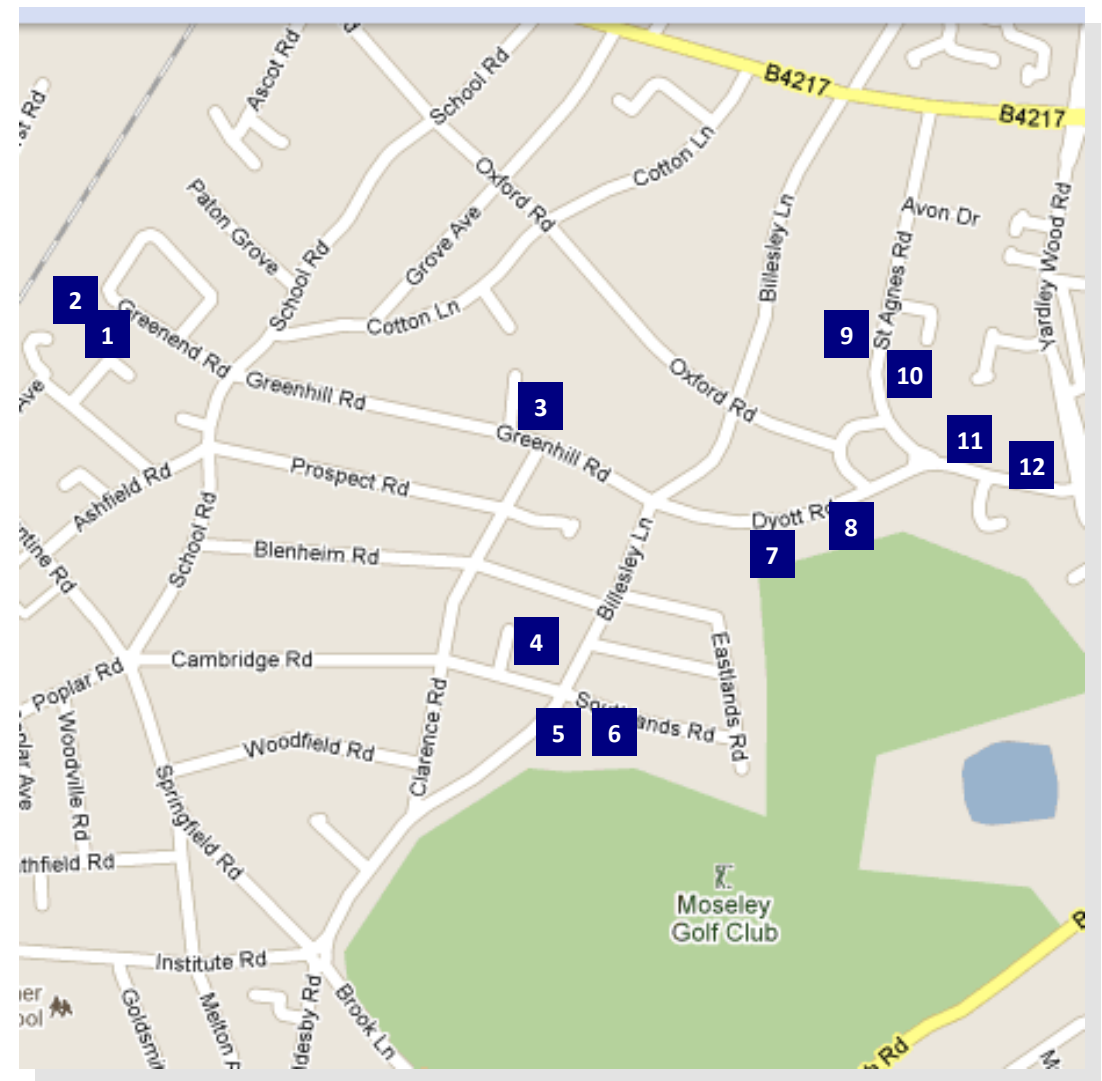
6 12 Southlands Road



One Step to negotiate down to a small but densely planted cottage style garden. A natural pond, garden shed, compost bins and vegetable beds.

7 21 Dyott Road

This is a 'natural' garden divided into four sections with shrubs, trees, a fern collection in a small wooded area and a pond; and with some quirky, light hearted features.

8 31 Dyott Road

This is an established garden with mature trees, shrubs, pool, rockery and vegetable area. As a bonus there are panoramic views across Moseley Golf Club. One step to negotiate.

9 15 St Agnes Rd

New owners have completely restored the house and transformed the garden in the space of just one year—all of which has been project managed themselves. There is plenty to see in this garden!

10 20 St Agnes Rd

A multi-use family garden with lawn and borders, a fish pond, chickens, a kitchen in the garden (nice brickwork to admire) raised vegetables beds and fruit trees. Two steps down onto the lawn.

11 48 St Agnes Rd

This attractive and carefully planned garden has interesting shrubs and herbaceous borders and an area devoted to vegetables and fruit.

12 56 St Agnes Rd

An attractive and tranquil garden, well stocked and co-ordinated. Three statues harmonise with the overall design, which includes a pool and water feature. One small ledge to negotiate

13 St Mary's Church

An Open Weekend for the church coincides with our Open Gardens weekend and there is plenty of interest in the heritage trail, focusing on the local history associated with the churchyard, the display/demonstration offered by local beekeepers... and in the cream teas!

NOTE: This venue isn't on the map but can be located on St Mary's row in Moseley Village centre.
