

7 Chantry Road – 6



A large patio area filled with pots and interest leads to the higher part of the garden with a large lawned area big enough for the kids to play ball games, but surrounded by lovely beds of perennials and shrubs. By the summer house at the top are three highly productive raised beds with a range of vegetables.

11 Chantry Road – 7



Gardens should have room and this one certainly has! Rising from a small terrace is a circular lawned area with raised beds around it. Through the arch there is a more formal garden with box hedged plots growing a variety of plants, and a greenhouse.

20 Chantry Road – 8



This extraordinary garden plunges into Moseley Private park which provides a perfect backdrop, including wonderful views of the lake, for a wide variety of planted areas, including a small vegetable plot at the bottom. Slippery when wet and plenty of steps!

32 Chantry Road - 9



Completely redesigned and planted by Sandilands Garden Design with a variety of themes including neo-classical and Japanese, this is a garden with everything. So much to see and enjoy, including an art exhibition and music!

Moseley Park and Pool – B



Opening its gates to the public for Moseley in Bloom, Moseley Park can be accessed from the gate in Chantry Road (next to St John and St Monica's School) – down steep steps - or from the High Street, from Alcester Road Gate and from Salisbury Road Gate. The park was opened in 1899 and is the only surviving part of the English landscape gardens of Moseley Hall (1792). It is a truly unique area, now run as a charity and organically managed. It contains the most stunning vistas across the lake and also has a bog garden with a series of bridges, a wildflower meadow and is a haven for wildlife. Truly a hidden gem.

Moseley Hall Hospital Footpath - A

By kind permission of the Primary Care Trust a chance to appreciate this lovely quiet green avenue which links Amesbury Road and the Dovecote on Alcester Road. It affords the only opportunity to view Moseley Hall, once sitting in acres of Repton-designed parkland. Visitors are requested to keep to the footpath as signposted and respect the fact that this is a working hospital.

83 Salisbury Road – 10



An inspirational garden built around the confluence of two natural streams which weave through the garden in deep terraced walkways and are crossed by four bridges bedecked in climbers. A lower and upper lawn, mature trees, scrubs and magnificent mature borders make this a magical place.

87 Salisbury Road – 11



A patio, then a lawn surrounded by a range of scrubs, trees and perennials leading to a rustic bridge crossing a deep stream whose steep banks are covered in ferns. The upper garden has both a vegetable patch and an area with a wild flavour, shadowed by very tall trees.

115 Salisbury Road – 12



From a wide terrace two lawned areas open up, each surrounded by a wealth of perennials and scrubs. The garden culminates with a woodland area with paths weaving beneath the canopy of trees, including a blue cedar.

40 Amesbury Road – 13



A spacious elevated crazy-paved patio leads to the main garden with a large lawn bordered by generously proportioned flowerbeds. A summerhouse, a sizeable vegetable area and an orchard and look out for the ceramic sculptures displayed in the garden

42 Amesbury Road – 14

Everywhere you look something unusual and interesting, super mix of colour and texture, a real plantsman's garden. Beware paths can be slippery if wet.



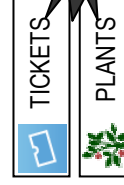
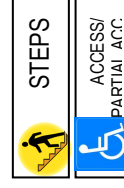
61 Reddings Road – 15

From a broad crazy -paved patio area with elevated decked seating is a lovely tiered garden. An unusual circular lawn, through a trellis smothered in climbers to a formal classical shaped pool with further room for seating around it. A summerhouse, vine and vegetable area at the top complete this charming garden.



Moseley Hall Dovecote, Alcester Rd - 16

Being restored and maintained by Moseley Society volunteers, the Dovecote garden is a work in progress with the overall ambition to create a community garden in keeping with the 18th century Dovecote and Cowhouse beside it. The garden is also to provide staff, patients and their visitors at Moseley Hall Hospital a quiet place to sit. Herb garden, kitchen garden, herbaceous border and orchard plus four new beds framed by box hedges and a wild area at the bottom of the plot.
