Floral displays are up!

The hanging baskets and planters have once again been installed in Moseley Village. With the help of our friends at the Council Parks and Nurseries, this year we are trialling a mixture pf perennial and annual plants in an effort to be more environmentally sustainable. At the end of the season we will retain the perennial plants for use next year or we may even make them available for people to buy. As usual, BCC staff have done a brilliant job and the funds raised by Moseley in Bloom have been used to pay for them.



Trafalgar Road Plan Bee

Residents of Trafalgar Rd have been helping the environment by making their front gardens Bee-Friendly. Last year, they leafleted the road and side roads and identified 'barren' areas to utilise Starting small, they managed three places as an experiment by Admiral Place, Harrisons Pleck and one entrance to the pocket park. In the Autumn six fruit trees were planted in the park free-of-charge by Fruit and Nut Village in Balsall Heath. This year over 60 new plants have been put in, although some were lost through lack of rain. The plants are ones that multiply easily in gardens and through cuttings. Watering however, is a problem. More neighbours are needed to help and would be given a watering can! They would love others to join in. Please contact Jude judegreenwood67@gmail.com if you can help. No Mow May - how was it for you?

How was it for you? Some of us loved No Mow May and noticed the flowers and grasses that grew in the verges, providing extra food and protection for birds and insects. Not everyone did though and apparently Council gardeners received many complaints from Moseley residents about the lack of grass cutting. In my road, a well-meaning neighbour decided to mow several verges during May, cutting down the self-sown and resident-planted wild flowers that had begun to spring up. Perhaps we need a more public discussion and information on why No Mow May was introduced. What do you think? We also learnt from our friends at Birmingham City Council Parks and Nurseries that hedge cutting is not permitted in the Summer. This is a legal requirement and Dave Connolly, responsible for the grass and hedges in Hall Green and Selly Oak, told us that DEFRA rules say we should not cut or trim hedges or trees between the dates of 1 March and 1 September without a derogation. You may only apply for a derogation if you plan to cut hedges before any new grass ley or oil seed rape is sown in the Autumn. So now you know!

Saving the Map

Members of Moseley in Bloom and the Litterbusters were out on the Green on 28 May, greening up and cleaning up. We weeded round the railings and started to clean the map. However, all was not simple. Parts of the wooden frame have rotted and the map needs some renovation as well as a good clean up. We are looking for someone who might be able to help with this? We need a person with woodworking skills who can examine and then repair the damage. Please do get in touch if you can help as we want to prevent further deterioration of this lovely piece of art.

Made in Moseley
