My Favourite Plant This Month - Notes from a Moseley Garden

Spring is here, sing the birds. Everywhere you go - tulips and daffodils, blooming camellias and cherries, brand new pale green leaves gathering strength each day for the summer ahead. My garden is no exception. So many bright stars to look at but one plant announces itself quietly and unexpectedly, making me stop to take a good look at my Bergenia 'Angel Kiss' (Dragonfly Series). It sits at the front of one of my borders, an evergreen handsome mound of shiny mid-green leathery leaves which turn deep burgundy as the autumn temperatures drop. In April, heads of white tubular flowers, each held in a reddish-pink calix, open above the leaves, tinging intense pink as they age - a precious sight to behold. Bergenia is an overlooked genus, in my opinion, but made up of excellent year round reliable, unfussy players, providing colour and texture in the most difficult of garden situations. They come into their own in the bare months of winter and early spring, and allow the divas to shine the rest of the year.
